- To help prevent hurt feelings and disappointments, please have a discussion with your child about taking responsibility for their own costume and about respecting other children's costumes. Children should also take extra care while playing outside for lunch and recess.

This Week in Ms. Rossi's Class

It's been another great week in our grade 4/5 classroom! Here are a few highlight from our week!

In math, we have been diving deeper into place value and decimals. This week, our focus has been on reading and comparing numbers with decimals, specifically tenths, hundredths, and thousandths. To reinforce these concepts, students played a game on whiteboards with partners. We find hands-on learning a great way to practice and solidify the skills we are learning!

Additionally, we have started a mini-writing project this week in the lead-up to Halloween. Students have become real estate agents and have been tasked with writing a descriptive writing piece where they will need to describe a spooky house that is for sale. Students began by walking around the classroom to observe pictures of various houses and recorded descriptive words and nouns to use in their writing.

Students also finished a Zentangle art piece which incorporates the use of different lines and patterns. Students experimented with their own line and shape patterns, selected their favorites, and used them to fill in their handprints before painting them.

A final highlight was the students' participation in the Student Vote. Students have been learning about the different levels of government, their responsibilities, and the political parties in Canada. Last week, we examined the candidates in the Kelowna-Mission region and their stances on various issues. Students then identified the party and candidate that best aligned with their beliefs and participated in a vote last Friday. They took the process seriously, creating ID cards and receiving 'I am a voter' stickers after voting. It was a valuable experience that allowed students to understand the importance of voting! This week, our class participated in discussion about the results of the Student Vote as well as of the provincial election and what this will look like for British Columbia.
