THIS WEEK IN MRS. TIDY'S CLASS

UBCO Stem Engagement Day

This week our grade three classroom visited the University to participate in a STEM Engagement Day. This is an annual event that aims to spark curiosity and inspire the innovators of tomorrow. The children participated in four hands on, engaging workshops. Our first workshop we visited a 3D printing design lab, and designed buttons followed by an exciting VR Lab where we flew drones over Kelowna.







Our next workshop was the Chemistry Lab. In the Chemistry Lab we became real scientists! Our class created gels from polymers, explored surface tension and the attractive forces between the water molecule, and an acid-base titration. This workshop was a favourite!



In the afternoon we used the design process to think of a new way to cross Okangan Lake. The children used a variety of materials to build a solution to this problem. All of the children decided to design and build boats! Our final workshop was learning about hisotric animals in North America. All of the children were able to touch and hold the fascinating bones and skulls!





Our STEM Engagment day was a success, and we were so grateful to have this opportunity.

Fall Painting & Clay Projects

In Art we finished our Fall Painting, which we displayed in the hallway. We also had Jim Elwood visit this week and show us how to make clay mugs. Our school is so lucky to have a working kiln so classes can work with clay!







Writer's Workshop

Our classroom is busy working on Personal Narrative Stories in Writer's Workshop. We are working towards making our writing interesting and clear. This week we continued our event stories focusing on using effective transition words and interesting details.

Math

This week in math we continued to learn efficient strategies for subtraction problems. One of the games we enjoyed to practice these facts was bubblegum bump subtraction.
