This Week in Mrs. Semmelink's Class

December has been an extra exciting month for our class with a special guest visiting us from the South Pole, a penguin we named Snowy. Each day, Snowy finds a new spot and activity to explore in our classroom. On Tuesday, he made the penguin art he is pictured with that we've been busy creating our own versions of in the class this week.





At the end of November, everyone drew and coloured one of their favourite winter memories. These were then hung up in our class windows to serve as a countdown to winter break. Every day in December, we reveal the "mystery artist" of the day who gets to share the story of their favourite winter memory with the class.

In our class, we try to embody the mindset of a scientist by being curious and observant as often as we can. Currently, we are learning about matter, physical and chemical changes. This week we made hypotheses for our experiment mixing pop and mints and observed a foamy 'explosion' as well as observed physical changes in melting and freezing chocolate to make a tasty white chocolate bark.
