Raymer Elementary History:

Raymer Avenue Elementary School was named after its location at the corner of Raymer Avenue and Richter Street.

Raymer Avenue was named after Mr. Henry William (Harry) Raymer. He was born in 1853 in Walsingham, Norfolk County, Ontario. His boyhood, public and high school days were passed in Woodstock, Ontario. While still a very young man, he went to work in Chicago. He stayed only a short time before returning to Canada. Mr. Raymer spent time in School Lake, Manitoba and Lethbridge, Alberta where he spent time farming and contracting. After several years, he moved further west arriving in Vernon on a work train to construct the CPR branch line from Sicamous. In 1892 he moved to what is now called Kelowna.

As a contractor and builder, he was responsible for the construction of many of Kelowna's buildings, which still stand today. These buildings include the Ben-voulin Church and Glenn Avenue School. Though engaged in the building trade, he played an important role in promoting the agricultural efforts as president of the Agricultural Association.

When Kelowna was incorporated as a city, he was elected mayor. He later served on council for several terms. He also served as a Justice of the Peace on the Police Commission and on the License Board.

Mr. Raymer built, owned and managed Kelowna's first Opera House thus providing the means of bringing entertainment to the community. He was one of our early supporters of Kelowna's Aquatic Center and helped to set aside Kelowna's City Park for that purpose. He also helped to start the first Kelowna Band, a brass one, in which he played bass trumpet.

Mayor Raymer died in Kelowna on April 6th, 1916 at the age of 63.

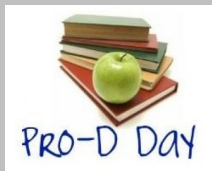
Dear Raymer Families:

Late Arrival Procedures

Students who arrive late (after 8:30) must sign in at the office. Students are marked absent if they are not in their classrooms when attendance is completed at 8:30. Students will be marked excused if the parent/guardian calls the school or provides a note.

Leaving Early Procedures

To ensure our students' safety, we can only release a child early when the student:

- provides a signed note from a parent/guardian indicating the time the child may leave school and the reason for absence
- is picked up by the parent or guardian
- parents/guardian use school messenger or call the school office to inform us of the early departure

Student Absence

A parent/ guardian should use school messenger or call the school at (250) 870-5125 to report a student absence. When students are absent with no phone call or prior notice excusing their absence an automatic call home will go home.

Parent Visitors

All parents/caregivers/guests to the school MUST enter through the front doors and **check in** at the office during regular instructional hours.

Volunteers will be provided with a visitor badge upon signing in and must have completed a criminal record check. Contact your child's teacher and/or the office for more information.

Student washrooms are for learners only. Staff washrooms are available for adults or adults with young children who still require their parent's assistance. These washrooms are located next to the office.

Student Pick Up

At the end of the day, your child will meet you at their designated pick up location. Your child needs to ask the office for help if there are any problems with pick up. Under no circumstances should your child leave the school grounds if he/she is expecting to be picked up.

Please ensure any adult who may be picking up your child is listed as "pick up person" in our system. Please call the office to make any changes.

School Messenger is the best way to let the office know that your child will be absent, late or needs to leave early.

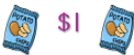


Reporting Absences with SchoolMessenger

SCHOOL FEES

Your child's school fees for the year are \$50.

- \$40 for school supplies provided by the teacher
- \$10 for cultural fees (school wide cultural performance)



The district is requesting and encouraging all families to sign up to access the online payment option. All student charges will be posted on this site (school fees, overdue books, field trips).

Within School District Policy 425—Student Fees, the Board of Education has indicated “that students will not be excluded from any educational program due to financial hardship.” This clause in the policy provides for the private and confidential consideration of financial circumstances of individual students and families, while preserving the dignity of families who may be unable to pay.

Please contact the school principal if you are facing a financial hardship that restricts the ability of your child to access a school program.

SCHOOL CASH ONLINE

The School District has moved towards an online system for paying student fees and field trips. The office requires families to use this service rather than sending cash or cheques.

PARENT PARKING

There is NO parent parking available on-site. Parents can use the short-term (15 minute) parking areas on Richter Street and on Raymer Avenue. Please DO NOT block driveways, vehicles, park on boulevards, or park in neighbouring business stalls.



HANDICAPPED PARKING

Spots are available via the Tutt Street entrance. Users must display a valid handicapped parking pass.



DOGS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

Just a friendly reminder that no dogs are allowed on school property as per the regional district responsible dog ownership bylaw. Thank you for your understanding.



BIKING/SCOOTERING TO SCHOOL

We encourage children to travel to school by foot, bike or scooter. We do want to ensure the safety of each child so please have your child wear a helmet, bring a bike lock to lock up their bike and abide by the rules of the road. Once your child arrives on school property they are to walk their bikes to their designated bike rack.



LOST AND FOUND

Any clothing or items left behind by students are placed in the lost and found which is located in one of three black benches at the entrance to the school, outside the office. Students and parents are encouraged to check the lost and found regularly to reclaim misplaced belongings. If an item is lost, students should immediately report the loss to their teacher and check the “Lost and Found”. All student belongings should be marked with your child’s name.

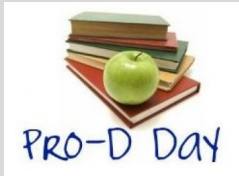


LIBRARY

ATTENDANCE



Not only is regular attendance a legal requirement under the School Act, it is also a major factor contributing to a student's success in graduating. Much of the learning at school occurs in classroom learning environments where teachers are constantly assessing student progress - to miss class time negatively impacts student learning, and makes the assessment of student learning extremely difficult for teachers.

For chronic attendance issues (excused or unexcused), parents/guardians will be asked to speak with the school administration to problem solve and collaborate ways to ensure student attendance improves and to ensure student success. We appreciate in advance your support in ensuring your child arrives to school on time each day ready to learn!

MEDICAL ALERT



If your child has allergies, asthma, requires medication while at school, or has any other medical condition, please inform the child's teacher and the office. There are specific forms that need to be completed on an annual basis in order to ensure the safety of your child.

COMMON COLDS AND VIRUSES



Influenza is caused by viruses that generally spread when an infected person coughs or sneezes. Here are six precautions to safeguard everyone's health:

- Stay home when experiencing flu like symptoms
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Cover your mouth or nose with a tissue
- Wash your hands, avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth
- Practice good health habits: plenty of sleep, be active, eat nutritious foods

GUARDIANSHIP



Occasionally concerns have been known to arise concerning the custody of children after a divorce or other legal action. Please make an appointment with a counsellor or administrator to discuss any special custody concerns you may have. Also, please bring a copy of any restraining order or other pertinent documents. Name changes can also be detailed at that time.

TELEPHONE



A telephone is available for students use but is restricted to phoning parents in the event of illness or other emergency. The student phone is not to be used to arrange social events or for incidental items forgotten at home. If you are needing to get in touch with your child throughout the day please call the office and we will be sure to pass along a message or have your child return your call.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS



Although we hope that our school will never be subjected to an emergency, we take Emergency Preparedness very seriously. The following drills and practice measures are taken at school:

- 6 fire drills/school year—3 in the fall and 3 in the spring
- 1 earthquake drill as part of Shake Out BC
- 1 lockdown drill

As a parent/guardian, if you are in the building during one of our drills please make sure you vacate the building through the closest exit and report to Mrs. Ng on the back concrete slab (basketball court)

DRESS CODE



Decisions regarding student dress require the careful balance of the individual's right to self-expression against the school's responsibility to ensure an appropriate learning environment. The dress code is based on the following principles:

- Respect for learning, human rights and dignity of others
- Safety of persons and property
- Promotion of a drug and alcohol-free environment

Raymer Elementary School with the Raymer Parent Advisory Council, offer the following guidance so that students learn to make good independent decisions regarding their choice of clothing. All members of the school community are expected to dress in ways that are appropriate for school. It is not appropriate to wear clothing that:

- Makes sexual reference
- Uses inappropriate language
- Depicts or promotes violence, racism, or other discriminations
- Is intimidating to others; has brand names that relate to profanity

All clothing must:

- Cover the entire core area of the body (upper thigh to above the chest)
- Have straps or sleeves

For safety purposes, footwear must be worn at all times and everyone is expected to refrain from wearing a hat or hood up inside the school building.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE



Central Okanagan Public Schools does not insure expense for student injuries that happen on school grounds or during school activities. It is possible for parents/guardians to voluntarily purchase private accident insurance at a reasonable cost.

PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL (PAC)



The Parent Advisory Council (PAC) invites all parents to join and play an active role in shaping the school community. Recognized under the School Act since 1989, the PAC serves as the unified voice for parents, fostering collaboration and dialogue on matters that matter most.

Through monthly meetings, the PAC addresses parent concerns, provides valuable support for school events, and hosts enriching presentations on topics of interest. Whether it's guiding individual concerns or navigating the appeal process, the PAC is here to empower and inform families every step of the way.

APPEAL POLICY 460

Parents and guardians of a student who is entitled to an educational program in SD 23 may appeal the decision of an employee of the school board which significantly affects the education, health or safety of the student.

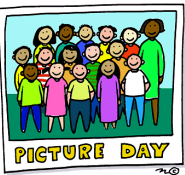
STEP 1: Parent meets with employee (eg. teacher)

STEP 2: Parent meets with principal

STEP 3: Parent meets with the superintendent or designate (eg. director)

If at this point, the issue remains unsolved and the parent is not satisfied, the parent has a right to a final appeal to the Board. Details of this process are available at the school. This district policy is in place to help ensure that effective communication is part of the problem solving process.

Responsible Student Use of Personal Digital Devices, School Technology, and District Network Services



Student use of personal digital devices (any device used to communicate and/or access the internet), school technology, and district networks at school is for educational purposes.

Students must abide by the school's Code of Conduct and procedures, as well as Central Okanagan Public Schools Policy 486: Student Use of Network Services and Digital Technologies.

Students will:

- Secure, power off and store personal digital devices during instructional (i.e. class time) and non-instructional time (i.e. breaks/lunch) at Elementary schools unless instructed by the Principal or school staff;
- Use personal digital devices during instructional time for instructional purposes and digital literacy skills as instructed by the Principal or school staff;
- Ensure personal digital devices are not used in areas where privacy is expected, such as restrooms and change rooms;
- Be permitted to use personal digital devices to support accessibility, accommodations, medical and health needs;
- Always take precautions to ensure online safety, privacy, and security;
- Treat others with respect and kindness when using digital devices and district network services;
- Always use digital devices and district network services responsibly and with academic integrity.

Schools will ensure that all students have equitable and developmentally appropriate access to technology to meet curricular requirements. Students are not required to have their own personal digital device or cellphone at school.

The use of personal digital devices, school technology, and district networks is a privilege. Staff may revoke a student's access to devices because of inappropriate student conduct.

Violations of the school code of conduct could result in appropriate restorative processes or disciplinary actions including suspension and police intervention.

RAYMER—CODE OF CONDUCT

At Raymer Elementary School, we strive to ensure that our school is a safe, caring and orderly environment where all our students and staff can learn and work.
