and donated.









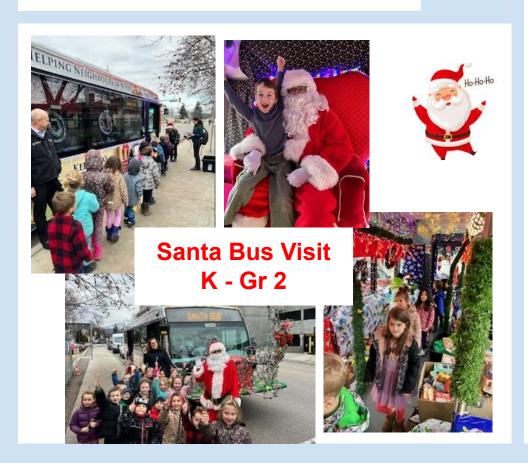
Rotary Centre for Arts with Brunn/Semmelink

This free 10-week course runs on Wednesdays from 6:30–8:30 PM, starting February 5th at the Parkinson Activity Centre. The program is designed for families with at least one child aged 8–12, and siblings aged 6, 7, or 13 are welcome to join as well.

The focus is on practical, fun activities that strengthen family connections while building valuable skills for both parents/caregivers and children to make lasting changes.
