

This Week in Mrs. Koch's Class

November Week with the Willows

Kindness, Respect & Responsibility

We continue to demonstrate kindness, respect and responsibility in our class. Our students work together, share and learn from one another and create a lovely learning space to be everyday. We are so proud of them.

Solomon shared that "our class is showing responsibility when we are focusing on our learning".

Daniel said, "we are learning about how to keep our community safe like Black Bear".

Reading Workshop

Daily we Read to Self, Listen to Reading, Word With Words and have Guided Reading with Mrs. Koch. We are learning a variety of strategies to decode words and practicing good reading habits. Becoming more fluent readers and retelling what we are reading were focuses of our small group lessons this week too.

Madison commented, "group lessons helps me become a better reader. When I find words that have the same ending and if I see them, I know them. There are even some words we can't sound out, so I want to know them by heart".







In Writer's Workshop - we are writing personal narrative stories. Writers have been telling stories to share something that happened in his or her own life. We have been crafting stories with a beginning, middle and end. This week we have been working on writing strong beginnings in our personal narrative. We have also started using temporal words ("time words") in several places within our stories.

This Week in Mrs. Koch's Class

Nova shared, "I love this time of day. I love writing to make up stories. Using time words makes it more interesting because it shows when something happened in your life or when it started". **Francis** shared, "stories allow me to do whatever I want, and I can make up my own stories instead of watching Netflix. Writing about my emotions and feelings helps me write my real life stories, I know what to write about next".

Georgia shared, "I like the provocation in class so I can build scenes about bear and how he lives. He's Chief of all living things on land".



Students began exploring the Four Food Chiefs. We wonder what we might discover about ourselves and others in our Learning Community.


Naturally, their wonders led us to an inquiry about bears. We've read stories about bravery, wisdom and done some art connected to this theme.

Levi and **Ethan** shared, "He's a leader like us because we follow the rules and help people in our class".

Ethan commented, "I'm a leader when I share and show others how to do things like making paper crafts".

Quinston and Oskar said, "Black Bear is wise and smart just like us".

And Emilia reminded us that "Chief Black Bear shows us to think like a thinker".



This Week in Mrs. Koch's Class

Math Workshop

We can... use a variety of strategies for adding equations.

We can... arrange, recognize and compare numbers to 100 (Gr. 2) and 1000 (Gr. 3).

Oskar said, "when we use doubles, friendly numbers and making 10 and 100, it helps us add and make harder questions be easy".

Emilia told us, "strategies help us with our mind math". And **Amy** and **Emilia** shared, "it helps us know our facts and strategies quick like lightning and we will need it for higher grade math".

Daniel thinks, "doubles are easy".

Jayden thinks, "grouping by 5 is easy for me when I count larger numbers".



We are preparing for the Christmas Concert too!





Solomon shared, "we are learning drumming techniques for our concert and it is fun because we're singing and moving around".

Emilia likes that, "we get to be creative and do our own dance moves and I love to sing Christmas songs".

Cooking Up Tasty Treats In Our Class Community

Amy and **Emilia** expressed, "we are tasting new things and foods that we haven't tasted before like the pumpkin soup. Cooking is one of our favourite things to do so lots of people in our class can try new foods and we can be healthy".
