





This Week in Mrs. McKay's K/1 Class

Math



Over the past few weeks, students have been practicing reading and building both pictographs and bar graphs. This week, we have been focusing on building different bar graphs through various activities. Students enjoyed making their own "Lucky Charms" bar graph by recording how many of each marshmallow they had. Later in the week, students practiced collecting data through a classroom scavenger hunt. They had to search for coloured dots, record how many they found of each colour, and then use a bar graph to determine which colour they found the most of. We ended our graphing unit at the end of the week by building our own graph. Students came up with a question, interviewed their peers and then built a graph to analyze the data!









Cooking Class

This week was our last cooking class with Mrs. Gaudreau. Some of our students helped Mrs. G make strawberry-banana smoothies for the class. Our cooking crew then had the chance to share their recipe cards and explain how they made the smoothies. This has been one of the class's favourite activities throughout the year. 



Writing

Our class has been learning all about non-fiction books. Last week, we started to get ready to write our own non-fiction book by researching different animals. This week we began writing! Science

We are growing butterflies! Last week, we welcomed two caterpillars (larva) into our class. This week, we have been observing them as they slowly turn into pupas and form their chrysalis. We also had a visit from some science students from UBC Okanagan on Monday. They helped deepen our understanding about living and nonliving things. Students got to learn about ocean life, make sea jelly, as well as touch a real sea anemone and crab!
